Hospitable Church equips congregations to practice radical, gospel-shaped hospitality toward families with **neurodivergent children** and children with **special needs**. Through the threefold ministry of Belonging, Presence, and Hope, churches intentionally prepare both their people and physical spaces to welcome these families before they ever arrive. This includes training volunteers, creating sensory-friendly environments, implementing a buddy system, integrating children into worship, and building ongoing relationships through initiatives like Prayer Pals. The goal is not simply to accommodate needs, but to fully integrate each person as a valued and essential member of the Body of Christ.

A ministry of BELONGING

A ministry of PRESENCE
